# Happy 4<sup>th</sup> of July

#### Five References to God in the Declaration of Independence

It always amazes me when otherwise intelligent people are unable to find evidence of God in our governing documents. The Declaration of Independence, the signing of which we commemorate July 4th, alone has five references to God—two in the first paragraph, one in the middle, and two in the last.

"When in the Course of human events it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation." Who is responsible for "the laws of nature" but God—certainly not man nor nature itself? The second reference to deity is " of "Nature's God," an explicit reference to God.

The third reference to God is the word "creator" found in the second paragraph. "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." This boldly identified our base for at least three unalienable rights as God, and the Founders identified this truth as self-evident. So passionate were they with respect to these three "God-given rights" that such was identified as the purpose of government. "That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed…"

The fourth and fifth references to God are found in the last paragraph. The rightness of our cause was left to God as judge. "We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these united Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States, that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown..."

The fifth and last reference to God asks for his divine protection in our revolutionary course of action. "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor."

#### Status Report #1 - Exterior Wood Arch Renewal

#### Sanctuary INTERIOR – Overview

Our beautiful sanctuary was built in 1975 – nearly 50 years ago ! If you take a look up at our wood ceiling, you'll agree it's rather fantastic woodwork ! We have 7 inch thick laminated wood support 'arches' that span 78 ft across the church to a center height of 24 ft. These arches are spaced 16 ft apart with 4 inch thick interlocking pine roof boards across with insulation and roofing above all. Everything is in premium condition with the exception of a small area above the choir where the roof leaked years ago.

#### Sanctuary EXTERIOR – Overview

This same wood ceiling continues outside, painted. There we have 2 smaller wood arches, 5 inches thick, near the Narthex entry doors. They span 47 ft across and support the roof overhang above the Christ statue and the small roof area above the entry doors. They are an architectural match to the interior arches. We have the original construction drawings & specifications and these arches are identified as 'exterior grade'.

#### Problems

Despite being rated 'exterior grade', these exterior arches have not held up well. They have been painted and repainted and most recently coated with a marine epoxy. The 'foot' of each arch was reconstructed 22 yrs ago when lower rotted wood was replaced with steel plates and new concrete pads.

Nevertheless, over time, despite best efforts to protect the wood, the lower portions of these arches are completely rotted and teeming with insects. We suspected termites but see no evidence. Research tells us spraying the arches with copper naphthenate will resolve the insect situation for many years and we did spray the 'dry' East arch. The West arch, however, is still drying out and wrapped in plastic in a manner allowing air circulation. When dry, we will spray the West arch with the same copper naphthenate.

#### Resolve

Property Committee members Dave Besel, Don Eelman, Dean Hottenroth, Joe Kingsley, Bob Newhard, and Erik Wistoft have finalized what we feel is the best functional, affordable fix. We had considered adding steel posts *alongside* the existing arches or cladding the arches with taller steel plates. But, in the end, we believe building concrete block piers *around* the arches to provide vertical & lateral support is best overall. It will be a different 'look' for us out front but with stucco and paint they will match the sanctuary. Each pier will measure 2 ft x  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  ft tall. The wood arch portions visible *above* the piers will require renting a 'lift' to complete prep & paint work which we will most likely contract out.

#### **Building Permit**

Codes are clear that "The demolition of any structure supporting a roof load shall require a permit." Our thinking is that we are simply building a block pier around the existing roof support, not altering or removing it. We discussed this with the masonry folks doing the work and they are comfortable proceeding without.

#### Cost

Our original estimate was between \$ 8,000 and \$ 18,000 for both piers. The higher number reflected city entanglements and permit costs.

Craig Koshler of Masonry Structures, Inc. has already completed the necessary slab extension work for the block piers "free of charge"! And, he is hoping to get Carrolls Building Materials to donate the 144 concrete blocks and said he will build the block piers as a donation to the church! This is a rare benevolence these days for sure! Accordingly, at this point, we have no written estimates and will report more in days ahead.

#### Funding

Church Council has set some money aside for this – it's been a known need for years. We don't know what the final cost will be and a Fund Raiser may be required. We just don't know yet. All to report next Lamplighter !
